



As you look over this Summer edition of the Gateway please remember that you, our citizens, our customers, have a very important decision to make on election day this May 7, about Issue 4. The outcome of Issue 4 will directly impact the quality of services provided by the City. The voting results will give city leaders direction as to what kind of city the residents wish to have. We have held off changing the income tax structure for the people who WORK in Gahanna for as long as possible, more than 35 years now. We are proud of the fact we have managed our money well and have been able to wait until now to make this request.

- If residents approve the change in our tax structure, the City will be able to sustain its current level of services:
- Maintain current level of service with Police Department;
 - Maintain current level of service with Service Department including snow plowing & street repair.

The revenue will provide for much needed capital investment into our community requested by the residents through our biennial citizen satisfaction survey:

- Needed road rebuilds / repairs;
- Construction of multipurpose trails including connecting the Big Walnut Trail;
- Needed improvements to Gahanna Swimming Pool.

This revenue will not fund enhancements like a new recreation center or new facilities, but it will help us repair or replace the things that we already have that are falling into disrepair and failing. The tax reform will allow the City to continue to invest in you, your families and your quality of life. If the measure fails, the leaders of the city will realign priorities based on our current funding. Services will be reduced or cut to insure a stable financial position. Examples of reductions or cuts may include:

Cuts

- Trail construction
- Swimming pool repair
- Parks maintenance including athletic field maintenance

Reductions

- Street sign program
- Road repair/replacement
- Snow plow standards
- Police staffing levels

Ninety-eight percent of our residents rate Gahanna's quality of life as "good, very good or excellent" and it is my job to maintain that quality of life. In order to do this, I have recommended we change the tax structure. A summary is below. Most of our residents will see no change or even a slight decrease in their rate, since most residents work outside of Gahanna. More detailed information, as well as a tool to calculate the impact to your personal income can be found at www.gahanna.gov/taxreform.

Issue 4 Summary:

- Increase the credit given to residents for income taxes paid to another municipality from 83.3% to 100%;
 - Increase the Gahanna local income tax rate from 1.5% to 2.5%. As always, retirement income is not taxed.
- A chart explaining the impact for residents who work outside of the City is below:

Informational Meeting – Sunday, April 28 from 5:30-7pm at the Gahanna Municipal Golf Course, 220 Olde Ridenour Rd.

Eligibility – You must be 18 or younger to join the team. You may be 19 if you are a 2013 high school graduate. Athletes only must be a member of the Gahanna Swimming Pool; family membership is not required.

Dive Team – You must know at least 2 dives to join the team. Dive Team is not intended to be used as lessons.

Swim Team – 10 yrs and under swimmers must know 2 strokes and have the ability to swim across the pool without stopping. 11 yrs and older must know at least 3 of the competitive strokes and be able to dive into water and swim several laps without stopping.

Booster Club Fees – \$10 for your first child and then \$5 for each child after that with a \$20 cap per family on this fee. This is applicable to, both, swimmers and divers.

Volunteer Requirements – Each family is required to volunteer 3 times during the season at the meets. If you do not work 3 times you will be charged \$25 PER MISSED SESSION. Signup sheets will be at team meeting and at the first week of practice. SIGN UP EARLY TO GET THE POSITIONS YOU WANT!

The City of Gahanna is committed to keeping communication lines open with residents. In our continuing efforts to provide timely and factual information, we have created this guide to help you understand how the City's finances are structured.

Like many of you, the City regularly evaluates its revenue and expenses. Through continual evaluation of this information, reasonable and responsible decisions are made.

It's our hope that this information will help you better understand how the City is funded and how your tax dollars are spent. As always, we welcome your feedback. 
The General Fund is the main operating fund of the City, through which a majority of the City's expenditures are paid and where most of the City's revenues are deposited. In Ohio, local income tax is primarily collected based on where individuals work. The bulk of the City's income tax collections (more than 70 percent in 2012) come from employee payroll withholdings from businesses located inside of Gahanna.

Working residents who are employed outside of the City receive credit for a portion of the taxes they pay to their work city, and consequently pay a reduced amount to Gahanna.



General Fund expenses are viewed by type or by function. The following identifies which departments are included in each functional category:

Public Safety - Police, Dispatch/911, Animal Control, Emergency Management and Public Health

General Government - City Council, Mayor, City Attorney, Mayor's Court, Civil Service, Records Administration, Human Resources, Finance and Public Information

Parks & Recreation - Operation & Maintenance of City-Owned Parks, Recreation Programming, Pools, Golf Course, and Senior Center

Community & Economic Development - Planning & Economic Development, Zoning, and Information Technology

Public Service - Engineering & Maintenance of Public Infrastructure and Vehicle Fleet

Transfers - Transfers from the General Fund to supplement other City funds including Debt Service and Capital Improvements.

In 2011, Public Safety made up the largest portion of the City's General Fund expenditures by function. Gahanna is ultimately a service organization. These services include public safety, engineering and maintenance of public infrastructure, community and economic development, parks maintenance, and recreation services.


Where Your Real Estate Tax Dollars Go

For tax year 2011, the City received just **three percent** of the real estate taxes paid by property owners.

For example, for an average home valued at \$185,100, the City would receive **\$118** of their approximate **\$3,940** tax bill.

Question: What is the current City of Gahanna Income Tax rate?

Answer: 1.5%

Question: What is the income tax change that is being requested by the Mayor and City Council?

Answer: To change the City of Gahanna income tax rate from 1.5% to 2.5%.

Question: When will the vote on the income tax take place?

Answer: The income tax issue will be on the May 7, 2013 ballot.

Question: When will the income tax take affect?

Answer: January 1, 2014.

Question: Who pays City income tax?

Answer: The primary source of the City of Gahanna's income tax is employee withholdings for individuals who work in the City. Currently, Gahanna residents also pay income tax to the City, but the amount depends on where they work due to the 83.3% reduced credit. A small portion of Gahanna's income tax revenue comes from taxes on the net profit of businesses located within the City.

Question: I don't work in Gahanna. How does the income tax increase impact me?

Answer: Your income tax rate paid to the City of Gahanna depends on the income tax rate in the City where you work. The City of Gahanna has created an online calculator that will help you calculate if your taxes will increase or decrease. www.gahanna.gov

This chart provides a general overview of the income tax implications based on income tax rate where you work.

Question: What change is being considered to the Credit?

Answer: The current income tax credit is 83.3% up to 1.5% for residents living in Gahanna that work in another community. If the income tax change passes, it will result in a 100% credit.

Question: I am retired and not employed. Will the income tax increase impact me?

Answer: No.

Question: Will this proposed change impact the property taxes I pay?

Answer: No.

Question: Why is the City requesting an increase in the City income tax?

Answer: Cuts in state and federal funding, declining interest rates, and the slower economy have contributed to a \$3 million annual reduction in general fund revenue. The City is facing an average of \$8 million per year annual deficit including the cost of repairing and replacing aging infrastructure.

Question: What will the income tax increase fund?

Answer: The funds will help maintain existing police, parks and recreation, and public works level of services. It will also provide investment in the City's infrastructure and economic development.

Question: What example capital improvements will happen if this issue passes?

Answer: The City will implement its Five-Year Capital Improvement plan which includes:

- Trails
- New Pool
- Increases street maintenance program

Question: What will happen if this issue does not pass?

Answer: The City will be required to cut City services and suspend capital improvement projects. Residents may see the following cuts in city services:

- Level of the City Police Department
- Parks & Recreation programming inclusive of closure of City facilities such as the Gahanna Swim Club
- Snow removal policies
- Street maintenance and safety programs
- Matching funds for potential state and federal grant programs

Question: Why did City Council decide to place the measure on the May 7, 2013 ballot?

In 2012, the City completed a Strategic Plan, Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan, and a Five-Year Financial Forecast. The plan shows the City will have an \$8 million budget deficit annually based on the current levels of City services provided and the capital investments needed in the community.

The City budget process begins in April of each year and includes many opportunities for input and analysis before the appropriations are finalized in late November. The May 2013 ballot will allow the City to follow its standard budget development processes. This will enable City officials to plan the 2014 budget based upon the election outcome.

A November 2013 ballot would not be sufficient time to complete the City's budget and would place strains on all City services regardless of the outcome.

Question: Who is eligible to vote?

Answer: Legal US Citizens who are Gahanna residents over the age of 18 are eligible to vote. Residents over 18 who are not registered to vote can contact the Franklin County Board of Elections at 614.525.3100 or by visiting <http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov>



Fee Structure

- The City of Gahanna's operations is funded primarily through income taxes paid to the City of Gahanna. For this reason, any person residing in the City of Gahanna, or who is an employee of a business located within the City of Gahanna (which also includes a spouse and/or child of such employee), will pay the **resident discount rate** when registering for a program or when reserving a Park and/or Golf Course facility. All others will be required to pay the **standard rate** otherwise noted. *Please note that even if you have a Gahanna mailing address and/or live within the Gahanna-Jefferson School District, you **MAY NOT** be a qualifying resident of the City of Gahanna.*

- In order to receive the **resident discount rate**, a person must live within the Gahanna City limits and **may be required** to verify proof of residency by showing a current City of Gahanna water bill, along with any valid photo identification. A full-time employee (spouse or child) of a business located within the City of Gahanna must provide proof of employment on company letterhead (with Gahanna address) signed by the personnel director or president of the company. Presentation of a valid photo identification of the employee is also required.

- Fees must be paid at the time of registration. Only receipt of payment reserves enrollment. **All programs have limited enrollment.**

Cancellation, Refund and Credit Policies

- **CLASS CANCELLATIONS:** We will contact you if a class has been canceled or filled to maximum capacity prior to processing your registration. If you do not hear from us, please attend the first class.

- **FACILITY CANCELLATIONS:** Reservations canceled more than 30 days in advance of the registration date will receive a refund, less at \$10 administrative fee. Cancellations 14-29 days in advance will receive a 50% refund; cancellations less than 13 days receive no refund. Changes or rescheduled reservations are subject to a \$10 administrative fee. No refunds for inclement weather.

Trails are Connecting Gahanna

In 2006, the City of Gahanna adopted the comprehensive Master Plan for the Department of Parks & Recreation. Throughout the process, it was apparent that the number one issue with residents was the development of trails and connectivity in the city. The department has made this a core service and results have been quick and well received. The most recent community survey reaffirmed this mission. Since 2006 the department has added over eight miles of trails. Sections 1 and 2 located at Morse Road and Cherry Bottom Road were the latest to open and added one mile of tree canopied trail along the Big Walnut Creek. This trail connects Academy Park and Woodside Green Park—two community parks which offer sports fields to fishing and playgrounds. Section 3, which is currently under construction, will continue the trail south and connect to the Nob Hill neighborhood. This section will open in late spring and will eventually connect to the Creekside District. Mature trees, rock walls and an amazing array of wildflowers throughout the entire year will make this trail a must see. South of the Creekside District, sections 6 and 7 were completed. Section 6 begins at the Gahanna Swimming Pool and meanders through open green space and past the pool, Veteran's Memorial Park and the VFW. The seventh section then heads east over a stunning 140 foot bridge surrounded by mature sycamore trees is also a must see. Along this section is the comfort station where trail users can

stop and take a break thanks to the donations from the family of Bob Toopes. This rest area, constructed by the Parks department, is a beautiful addition to the trail. In 2012 the Tech Center Bridge was completed and created another new trail opportunity. This trail connects Hamilton Road over I-270 via on street bike lanes and dedicated trail. It continues through a beautiful green space and completes itself at Taylor Road. Eventually this trail will continue onto Gahanna Woods State Nature Preserve and Park. All of these major trail developments along with smaller sections continue to create connectivity and recreational opportunities throughout the community. The Big Walnut Trail will eventually continue north where it will connect to the Alum Creek Trail and the Ohio Erie Trail. 


