OVERVIEW

GoForward Gahanna's Listening and Learning Workshops kicked off with 10 public workshops taking place in different parts of the city plus an online forum. The 10 meetings were divided into two categories: general workshops and topic workshops. The general workshops were located in each of Gahanna's four wards and had a consistent format. The focus of the meeting was small group discussions in response to, *"What do you care most about in Gahanna?"* These meetings took place at the following locations:

- General Meeting 1 – Royal Manor Elementary
- General Meeting 2 – Chapelfield Elementary
- General Meeting 3 – High Point Elementary
- General Meeting 4 – Gahanna Lincoln High School

The topic workshops focused on specific themes or audiences including:

- Business and Economy – Benchmark Bank
- Community Involvement – Gahanna Senior Center
- Parks and Recreation – Gahanna Senior Center
- Roads and Infrastructure – Gahanna Senior Center
- Youth and Student Engagement – Gahanna Lincoln High School
- Student Council – Gahanna Lincoln High School

After compiling input from all of the ten meetings, four themes stood out. When asked, "what do you care most about in Gahanna," the most responses came in the following categories:

1. **Parks and Recreation**
2. **Planning and Development**
3. **Public Safety**
4. **Social Interaction**
5. **City Leadership**
6. **Schools**
7. **Branding**

Purpose

The city has launched a strategic planning process. One of the key inputs to process is the insight from the community. The workshops and online forum were designed to provide ample opportunities for residents and other stakeholders to help shape the plan's recommendations.

Workshop Format

Workshops included a brief orientation and then a facilitated discussion on the needs and opportunities for Gahanna to be better tomorrow than it is today. Participants were seated in groups of up to eight. Each group had a table leader who recorded the ideas. The table leaders ensured the group stayed on topic and on time, allowing all participants a chance to be heard.

Introduction and Welcome (10 min.) – The workshop began with a welcome from city officials including the Mayor and City Administrator. Following this the consultant introduced the process and stated the meeting’s intention.

Project Overview (10 min.) – Consultants described how the city is beginning a process to develop a strategic plan. Explanation was given how this process is rooted in measured outcomes with participant priorities to be based on focused results. To establish the participant priorities, a robust community input program is being conducted.

Small Group Work (60 min) – The majority of time was reserved for a facilitated discussion on what people care most about in the City of Gahanna. A group of facilitators were trained at each meeting to conduct the sessions, leading groups of six to eight participants through the discussions regarding their ideas for how to make Gahanna better tomorrow than it is today. Participants were first asked to individually write down what they cared most about in Gahanna. Facilitators then went around one by one and recorded these ideas. After recording, each participant was given five colored dots to vote on their highest priorities. The ideas with the largest amount of dots were in response to, “Why is that important?”

Reporting (5 min.) – Following the group’s completion of the brainstorming session, the table leader reported to the larger assembly the highest voted ideas generated by their group.

Closing Remarks and Next Steps (5 min.) – City officials and consultants gave a brief conclusion statement and outlined remaining workshops. Furthermore, details were given about the March results workshop which will offer an opportunity for residents to learn about how they can get involved to achieve the goals set forth by City Council.

Outreach Strategy

The objective for engagement in this process was to make sure Gahanna residents of all ages and other stakeholders had a choice to participate. To do so; consultants, planning staff and the Outreach Committee conducted several outreach and publicity tasks.

Press

- Print advertisement in This Week News Gahanna (two front page articles).
- Mayor Kneeland recorded a video which was displayed during high school morning announcements promoting the youth/student engagement workshop

Email Correspondence

- Council members corresponded with their ward residents
- High school principals sent emails to parents of current students (youth meeting)
- School principals at all levels (elementary, middle and high school) sent out materials to parents in the school district
- Gahanna PTO volunteers sent emails to PTO members
- Outreach team email sent to their extended networks including church groups and scout troops
- City of Gahanna sent out the city-wide e-newsletter (1,663 recipients, 2 editions of the e-newsletter) outlining the workshop schedule, project information, and links to the Open Town Hall Forum
- City of Gahanna sent out targeted emails to state and local elected leaders representing Gahanna (school board, county commissioners, state representatives, etc.)
- City of Gahanna sent out emails to all City staff, many of whom reached out to their own networks outlining the workshop schedule, project information and links to the Open Town Hall Forum
- Parks and Recreation Department notified program participants (nearly 6,000 people) about the workshops and Parks and Recreation meetings

Social Media and the Web

- Dedicated project website was created, www.goforwardgahanna.gov
- City of Gahanna's Facebook page (3,278 followers) made 21 posts
- GoForward Gahanna Facebook page (554 followers) made 32 posts
 - Included links for meeting information and images of workshops
- City of Gahanna's Twitter page (5,108 followers) made 21 posts about the workshops
 - Included links for meeting information and images of workshops
- Open Town Hall Forum had an added conversation with the question 'What do you care most about in Gahanna?'
 - This offered residents who could not attend, an opportunity to share their ideas in a similar format to the in-person workshops
 - Several Facebook posts were made with links to the Open Town Hall Forum

Outreach Team

- Approximately 700 people reached via email
- More than 10 Facebook posts shared from City of Gahanna reaching over 4,500 people in personal networks
- Nearly 60 people personally invited

Print Collateral

- 1,500 workshop Rack Cards were distributed in person and at general locations
- 2,500 GoForward Gahanna business cards were handed out by city officials and the outreach committee
- Posters were produced and distributed at the YMCA, libraries, and city facilities

Initially only nine workshops were scheduled, one of which was aimed at high school age Gahanna residents. Through interaction with school staff and student word-of-mouth, Gahanna-Lincoln High School's student council advisor personally reached out requesting an additional workshop with his 25 youth leaders. The final workshop was conducted during school hours in a classroom setting, utilizing the designed workshop format.

Participation Summary

Nearly 200 people attended the 10 workshops over the course of three weeks. Qualitative data was able to be collected through an exit questionnaire. There was a very high satisfaction rate from the 81% of participants who completed exit questionnaires. Over 99% of participants reported they were: comfortable with the small group setting; felt as if their voice was heard; and will continue to participate in the planning process.

PARTICIPANT PRIORITIES

The workshop participants generated nearly 1,000 ideas and comments related to what they cared most about. This input was analyzed and categorized in an attempt to understand priorities. It is important to note this input represents qualitative research and is not a statistically valid sampling of residents. Below is a summary of the most frequently shared comments

What we heard

944 ideas were collected through the small group discussions. Table leaders listened to and transcribed ideas on table sheets. These ideas were distilled into seven categories with the following percentage of each:

The following section includes the seven categories and the most prevalent themes within each. Each priority has an action that should be taken with reasons as to why, voiced by participants.

1. Parks and Recreation (27%)

Greenspace: Increase the amount and accessibility

- Increase associated property values
- Attracts new residents and businesses

Healthy lifestyles: Add recreational opportunities through facilities and programming

- Creates more healthy lifestyles
- Promote community wellness programs
- Create a healthier Gahanna

Maintenance: Keep facilities and open spaces clean and up-to-date

- Provide feeling of a family friendly community
- Sustain a quality of life for all ages

Programming: Develop more options for health and wellness programming

- Engage the age spectrum through youth and adult programming
- Through year-round activities, can ensure children have daytime activities and senior citizens are actively engaged
- May provide a revenue stream for the city

Partnership: Encourage business and government to work together

- To expand park programming with additional resources
- Optimize the usage of existing facilities with better scheduling

Pools: Keep and maintain community swimming pools

- To provide a place of recreation to kids during the summer
- Encourage physical activity and community interaction with pools and their programming

Recreation center: Add an indoor community and recreational center

- Would provide programmatic opportunities year-round
- Could provide a revenue source with spaces available for reservation

Sports fields: Add more fields and better maintain existing facilities

- Better maintain turf at existing facilities for sports tournaments
- They provide an opportunity for sports leagues or regional tournament
- These could serve as a revenue source as well as promoting healthy outlets for the youth.

Trails: Add new trails and consistently maintain existing trails

- Provide residents connectivity options with other jurisdictions and increase walkability
- Multi-use paths could serve as a transportation alternatives between residential and employment centers to promote healthy lifestyles and reduce vehicular congestion

2. Planning and Development (24%)

Creekside: Support and update as needed

- Is a large financial investment by the city and needs to be supported
- Celebrate the development as it brings people downtown

Diverse economic base: Bring a broad range of job sources and funding to the city

- “Having only one type of revenue source is dangerous.”
- Strive to appeal to smaller local business owners to locate in existing vacant locations throughout the city
- Consider the attraction of future generations with potential development opportunities

Housing options: Provide a range of housing types and price points

- Allow residents to age in place
- Offers residents in all financial situations a place to be part of the community

Planning and enforcement: Enact consistent long range planning and enforce plans in the short term

- Establish long range planning to provide structure for future development
- Redevelopment opportunities should promote infill while maintaining the character of Gahanna
- Enforce zoning and maintenance standards for a consistent aesthetic

Walkability: Provide better pedestrian infrastructure

- Promote a healthy lifestyle and simple recreational opportunity
- Reduce vehicular traffic
- Increase foot traffic for local business owners

Character: Maintain the feel of Gahanna

- Consider future development and planning choices with the existing character in mind
- Respect and celebrate the existing small town feel

3. Public Safety (15%)

Maintenance: Provide upkeep and improvements of roadways, curbs and sidewalks

- Ensure reliable transportation
- Make the area more attractive for prospective residents and businesses

Safety: Maintain a level of safety

- It is currently a strong point for the community
- Entices new residents and businesses to the area

Traffic: Upgrade current infrastructure

- Monitor traffic and upgrade to meet demands
- Provide connection points to surrounding communities
- Study patterns as there is confusion at some intersections, creating hazardous driving conditions and increased traffic

4. Social Interaction (12%)

Communications: Better connect with residents

- Connect with a diverse audience for civic events, meetings, and organizations
- Create a better web presence that is a one-stop-shop for civic events and organizations
- To increase effectiveness of existing publications made

Community pride: Form a stronger identity through events and programs

- Increase community pride through civic events and increasing arts and culture programs.
- Defines the city and creates an identity.
- “Let’s raise the bar and make it a better community to live, work and play.”

Seniors: Increase programming and communication

- Allow for senior residents to have year-round and daily activities and programming
- Develop a communication network for elder residents’ opportunities for activity and transportation

5. City Leadership (9%)

Communication: Improve public communication network

- To allow for more public input
- Regularly inform public about government decision making
- Promote collaboration between community organizations about decision making and schedules

Tax structure: Maintain manageable level of taxes

- Attract more businesses and families through a low tax structure

Sustainability: Improve fiscal responsibility and financial stability

- Ensure the longevity and vibrancy of the city

Transparency: More clarity to public in decisions and better communication

- Increase accountability regarding financial decisions
- Provide more transparency with planning and city partnerships

6. Schools (7%)

Higher quality: Maintain/increase the quality of schools

- Current level of schools attracts families to the community
- Maintain existing school facilities
- Consistent teachers help retain students and families

Overcrowding: Consider the capacity of existing school infrastructure

- Would rather see expansion of the current high school, opposed to splitting into two schools
- Growth by the school should be in-house to maintain friendships and not create City of Gahanna school rivalries

Partnership: Grow relationships between government, area groups and schools

- Leverage the expertise of area organizations to facilitate collaboration
- Align school strategic plans with city strategic plans to grow in unison

7. Branding (6%)

Community brand: Strengthen and grow the brand

- Raise awareness to a population outside of the city limits, attracting residents and businesses
- Celebrating the “wins” of the city as well as historic past shows how the city is successful
- Advertise the city’s excellent location and desirable traits

Sense of place: Develop design guidelines

- Create a unified look for buildings and property aesthetics
- Provide consistent street signage for navigation and curb appeal
- Add gateway features to call out entrances of the city to know when you arrive in Gahanna

Streetscape: Enhance drive sequences

- Design streets with plant material and consistent signage
- Maintain landscape and tree guidelines along major arterial and community connectors

LISTENING AND LEARNING WORKSHOP RESULTS

This portion of the memo summarizes the input received during the workshops and additional outreach activities.

Who we heard from

Over 150 exit questionnaires were collected which provide insight into the participation in the workshops and additional outreach activities. This information is not intended to offer statistical validation of the process, but to understand the characteristics of the participants (the exit questionnaire data reflects only those who responded, not all participants). Also, since not all participants answered every question, there may be variation in total responses among different topics. Of the total number of participants, approximately 81% completed the questionnaires.

Participants were mostly middle-age or older. The age profile of exit questionnaire respondents is older than that of the 2010 Census. Higher numbers of those aged 55-64 attended the workshop, as 26% of respondents were in this age cohort, compared with 13% from the Census.

Younger demographic was under-represented. There were only 12% below the age of 24 and 12% over 65, and this contrasts with the Census data of 35% below 24 and 12% over 65.

Participants slightly more female oriented. Nearly 54% of individuals involved were female. This compares to the U.S. Census information which is only 51%.

Racial composition somewhat aligns with that of entire community. Roughly 92% of respondents identified as White/Caucasian, whereas 82% identified as such in the community's distribution in the 2010 census. Around 3% identified as Black/African-American, compared with 11% in the Census.

Representation from various income levels however the highest representation from those earning more than \$100,000 in family household income. A total of 47% of respondents identified their household income at a level above \$100,000 per year. This is close to 17% higher than would be indicated by the U.S. Census. This disparity seems to be due to the lower turnout of middle to lower middle income participants. The groups identifying with household earnings below \$50,000 comprised 12%, in comparison to 23% as indicated by the Census. Additional outreach steps may be required to attract this segment to upcoming events.

Participants generally have high levels of education. Respondents had higher overall levels of educational attainment including 26% with a master's degree or higher. This compares to an expected 13% from the U.S. Census. In addition to advanced collegiate education, respondents also had a higher percentage with a college degree (37% compared to 26% from the 2010 Census).

Most participants are longtime Gahanna residents. A total of 60% of respondents have been residents of Gahanna for over 20 years. Another 27% have lived in Gahanna for over 10 years.

Majority of participants own property. Over 83% reported owning property within Gahanna. This compares to 77% owner-occupied from the U.S. Census. More than 10% of participants also reported owning businesses within the community.

Motivation

The exit questionnaires polled participants about their interests and opinions about the workshops. The results indicate high levels of satisfaction.

How did you hear about the workshop?

Word of mouth – 46%	Newspaper – 24%
Facebook – 36%	Email Newsletter – 22%
Gahanna website – 23%	Flyer/Rack card – 8%
Online news – 2%	Community Event – 7%

Why did you choose to attend the workshops?

Participants had a variety of motivations for attending the workshops. Several respondents expressed comments such as “To give input for a better Gahanna” and “I care about Gahanna.” Specific motivations cited include:

- To have a voice in the community
- Because I am a student who cares about the future of the city

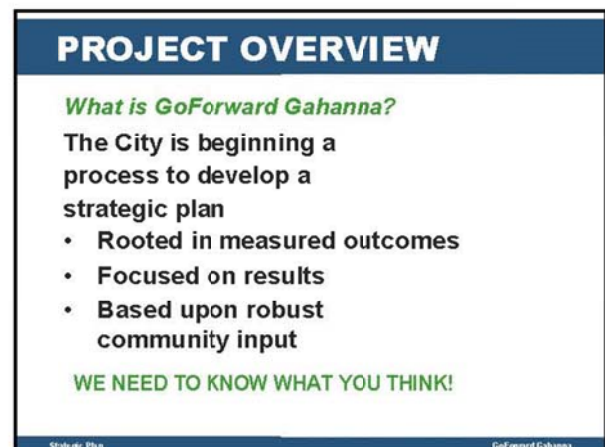
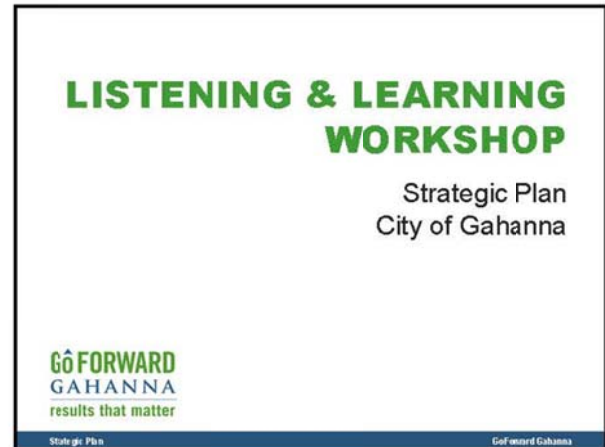

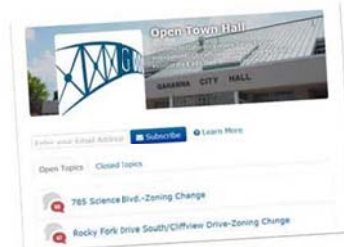

A Community-driven Strategic Plan is a guide that expresses the values and aspirations of a community. It defines strategic priorities for the community and the results that are required to achieve them. It is based on inclusive input from anyone in the community that cares about the future of the place they live, work, or play. These aspirations are integrated with technical analysis of conditions and trends to create a compelling action agenda for the future that is rooted in measured results.

2. *Why does Gahanna need a Community-driven Strategic Plan?*

In general, planning represents good stewardship. There has never been a better time to consider our community's values in light of local, regional and national trends, and develop well-supported policies to create the best possible future. The city of Gahanna sees the importance of creating a plan that is rooted in measured outcomes that will achieve specific results for the community. This plan will be strategic, priority and results driven and most importantly implementable.

3. *Who will lead the strategic planning process?*

The city staff is working closely with two planning consulting firms to facilitate the public process and work closely with the city departments to create a realistic strategy for the future of Gahanna that is based upon desired outcomes and measures. There is also an Outreach Team, which is broad-based citizen group charged with spreading the word about the process and inviting people to participate.

4. *How is the strategic plan different from the Economic Development Strategy?*

The strategic plan process is a community-wide planning effort – it will focus on developing strategies for a number of different aspects to community life such as parks and recreation, youth, transportation and infrastructure. This is a separate and different process that is just kicking off. The Economic Development Strategy focused solely on economic development and business growth opportunities and was completed in mid-2015.

5. *Is there a role for residents to get involved?*

Yes! City leaders are committed to an open and inclusive process. Anybody that cares about the future of Gahanna will be able to participate and contribute their ideas and insight.

6. *How can I participate in this planning process?*
