Sustainable2050 is a voluntary certification program that helps local governments to achieve their sustainability goals as related to the Regional Sustainability Agenda.

Sustainable2050 members earn certification points in the program by implementing sustainable policies and practices that seek to meet the objectives and goals of the Regional Sustainability Agenda (RSA). Based on points earned, Sustainable2050 members may attain four levels of certification:

- bronze
- silver
- gold
- platinum

To be eligible to participate in Sustainable2050, your organization or community must be a dues-paying Member or Associate Member of MORPC, or a Green Pact member as of June 8, 2017.

Members and Associate Members must:

- Pass a resolution of participation
- Designate a local champion
- Assign a representative to participate in program meetings
- Share data with MORPC as related to the goals and objectives of the RSA.

About the Workbook:

- Each worksheet represents one Goal of MORPC's Regional Sustainability Agenda (RSA).
- Each worksheet contains the objectives of each goal of the RSA.
- Each objective includes a list of eligible activities or strategies adopted in the RSA. "Other" activities that a member would like to have considered should be described in the corresponding objective and goal. Please note that "other" activities can be considered in place of one that is not completed within an objective for the equivalent point value.
- Strategies marked with an asterisk (*) are Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) oriented strategies.
- There are 37 DE&I strategies and members will be recognized as DE&I Champions when communities implement 10 of the total DEI strategies. This designation will be in addition to the attained tier status.
- To calculate the tier status of members, each strategy has been assigned a one-point mark while asterisk marked strategies are assigned a two-point mark. A culmination of points will determine the tier status (See chart in Community Profile worksheet).
- There are 145 possible points for all completed strategies. The tier status of Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze is determined by attaining 75%, 50%, 30% and 15% of total possible points.

Directions for the Workbook:

- Fill out the Staff/Champion contact information on the Community Profile worksheet.
- Answer the three Mandatory Action questions on the Community Profile worksheet.
- New to Community Profile worksheet: If your community/organization has established a relevant advisory committee or green team, then add 2 points in the appropriate row (above "total"). After you submit your workbook, the MORPC team will adjust the total points.
- The Tier Status will autopopulate. Move to the next worksheet.
- For each goal, the process will be the same:
- Select the appropriate "Status" of each eligible activity from the dropdown box in Column E.
- Column F provides a space to insert or upload supporting documentation for a strategy. To embed a document, go to the Insert tab and select the Object option in the Text group and choose the documentation from your computer to include.
- Indicate the Staff Lead of the Eligible Activity in Column J.
- Column K indicates the points possible for a particular strategy.
- At the bottom of the worksheet, the number of Eligible Strategies marked "Completed" or "Ongoing" will be tallied.
- Move to the next worksheet until Workbook has been completed.
- Once the Workbook has been completed, and all relevant documentation has been provided, please inform Brandi Whetstone, Sustainability Officer, bwhetstone@morpc.org

Definitions of "Status" Options:

- If your community has implemented an eligible strategy that 1) improves municipal operations or 2) is available to the public and improves the community's overall sustainability efforts, select "**Completed**" or "**Ongoing**" from the dropdown box of the corresponding activity.
- If your community is currently implementing a project, but no components are currently available for use (or have a measurable impact on municipal operations or the community's sustainability efforts), select "**In-Progress**" from the dropdown box of the corresponding activity. If a project is multi-phased, and some components of the project have been implemented, select "**In-Progress**." (e.g.. 2 of 5 electric charging stations have been installed and are available for use) Staff will review projects in progress to determine if the eligible activity will count toward tier status.
- If your community has plans to implement an eligible activity, but construction or implementation has not yet begun, select "**Planned**" from the dropdown box of the corresponding activity.
- If your community is not working on an eligible activity, select "**Not Planned**" from the dropdown box of the corresponding activity.
