Street Rebuild - Frequently Asked Questions

What work will be completed on my street?

The major work items planned for your street are as follows:

- Complete removal and replacement of the roadway and curb
- Removal and replacement of your driveway approach

How long will my road be closed for the street rebuilds?

The contract allows for a complete roadway closure of 16 days. There will be additional intermittent interruptions to traffic for the work, but full closures should be limited to approximately 16 days (weather dependent).

How will my trash service be handled?

The City will provide dumpsters at designated locations for each street project. Golf carts will be provided by the contractor to help residents transport trash from their homes to the provided dumpsters.

Where will I be able to park my vehicle?

During the roadway closure, parking will be available on adjacent roadways in the area. We understand the inconvenience of hauling groceries, etc. long distances to your home, so the contractor will provide golf carts to help transport heavy loads from your home to your vehicle and vice versa.

How will I be notified of project updates, etc. during construction?

Door hangers will be provided throughout construction to provide residents with any pertinent notifications, or updates regarding the roadway construction.

What are the typical working hours?

General construction hours shall be ½ hour before sunrise to ½ hour after sunset Monday through Saturday. The contractor will not be allowed to perform work on City observed Holidays.

When is the construction expected to begin?

The contractor is not permitted to close any rebuild streets before May 27, 2020 and they must be completed by August 11, 2020.

Who is the general contractor that will be performing the work?

The general contractor performing the work is Strawser Paving Company. This company has worked for the City in the past with good results.

What grass seed will be used?

The seed mixture is the ODOT Urban Seed Blend which consists of 30% Creeping Red Fescue, 30% Kentucky Blue Grass, 20% Perennial Ryegrass, and 20% Gulf Annual Ryegrass. Disturbed areas will be hydro seeded with a mixture of mulch, fertilizer, water, and seed.

Can I use my own seed mixture?

Yes, please contact City of Gahanna Project Administrator, Jason Collins as soon as possible to opt out of reseeding. Contact information is listed below.
