

Mason Jar



Bunnies

You'll need...



Glass Jar

Sharpies or Paint Markers

Pom Pom or Cotton Ball

Stiff Felt or Card Stock

Acrylic Paint

Glue

Ribbon

Glue Gun

Step 1

Using acrylic paint (or spray paint) paint the outside of your jar. We used an empty salsa jar. You may need several coats to cover completely.



After the jar is dry, you can decorate with more detail (we chose dots).



Step 2

Give your bunny a nose, mouth, eyes and whiskers. You can use permanent markers, paint markers, or brush on acrylic paint with a steady hand.

Step 3

Cut two ears out of stiff felt. Or, if you don't have felt, try card stock or paint thin cardboard (a cereal box works well). Cut a smaller piece in a different color for the inside of each ear. Glue the pieces together then glue them to the top of the jar.



Step 4

Cut a piece of ribbon long enough to tie around your jar and make a bow. Put a line of hot glue or tacky glue around the top of the jar and tie the ribbon on.



Step 5

Glue a pom pom or cotton ball onto the back of the jar to make a bunny tail. We used a glue gun but any glue should work.

You're Done!

Use your bunny jar as a festive spring decoration, fill it with yummy Easter treats or even use as a vase for flowers that may be popping up in your yard.
